

Response to Legislative Inquiry

Based on email from Kara McCraw on May 26, 2021

Submitted on June 17, 2021, updated June 22, 2021

As response to a request from legislative staff, NCDPI presents the following survey data from LEAs and Charter Schools.

The purpose of the survey was to collect information at the district level of (1) students who schools were unable to make contact with over the year at all and who did not enroll somewhere else and (2) students who will be retained at this point.

Important Notes:

- Regarding retention data, these numbers do **not** take into account the summer extension programs occurring in all LEAs right now. Many LEAs shared that the retention numbers will not be accurate because they anticipate great learning progress this summer.
- Please note the denominator is the total number of students enrolled in the LEAs/Charters who submitted responses.
- Results are based on responses from 107 LEAs and 186 Charter Schools.
- No response was received from 10 LEAs and 22 Charter Schools (see table below for specific districts).
