Dear Americans of Faith,

This is a unique moment for believers. For the first time in modern history, a U.S. president has called our nation to prayer—to humble ourselves and to rededicate America to God. This is a call for unity, repentance, and hope, and one that truly transcends politics.

I invite you all to join us on Sunday, May 17<sup>th</sup> on the National Mall for what I believe is a civilizational moment in the history of our country. This will be the first time that Americans will gather together to rededicate the United States as One Nation Under God.

On May 17, 1776, the Second Continental Congress held a day of “prayer, fasting, and humiliation” just weeks before America declared its independence on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Now, exactly 250 years to the day, tens of thousands of Americans will stand together as one in our nation’s capital to give thanks for God’s blessings over the last 250 years—and to ask for His forgiveness, mercy, and guidance as we embark on the next.

Through worship, prayer, and storytelling, we will remember the people, sacrifices, and foundational moments in which God has shaped our history. By the end, I hope you will see the truth in Benjamin Franklin’s famous admonition: “that God governs in the affairs of men.”

During this event, you will hear from faith leaders and public servants including Jonathan Roumie, Jentezen Franklin, Jack Graham, Lou Engles, Jonathan Pokluda, Cissie Graham, Secretary Pete Hegseth, Dr. Ben Carson, Eric Metaxas, and Bishop Robert Barron. This event will be accompanied by music throughout, including a worship concert with Chris Tomlin, Blessing Offor, and Aodhan King following the moment of rededication.
